5. DEPARTMENT REPORTS

5.1. SUBJECT

Meeting Minutes for August 15, 2023

RECOMMENDATION

Commission to review the draft Public Safety Commission meeting minutes for August 15, 2023, and adopt as final.

A motion was made by Commissioner Rojas, second by Commissioner Espinosa, to approve the Public Safety Commission minutes as presented.

5.2. SUBJECT

Public Safety Measure F Expenditures from July 1, 2023 through September 30, 2023 (KS)

RECOMMENDATION

Staff requests the committee to accept and approve the presented financial report representing expenditures from July 1, 2023 through September 30, 2023 in accordance with Resolution No. 2005-83.

Finance Director Solis provided the summary of the FY 2023-2024 first quarter. Revenues received for the first quarter were \$258,952 from sales tax and \$23,852 from investment earnings for a grand total of \$282,804.

Solis shared the Measure F Police Department expenditures for the period of July 1, 2023, through September 30, 2023, this reflects the amount paid for eight Officers, one Detective, and two Dispatchers. There was a total of \$332,934 expensed for the first quarter for the patrol division. Solis also reported the principal and interests for the units paid out of Measure F. Currently, the department has received nine out of the ten new units ordered. The total expenses for the police department were \$564,457.

Chair Contreras inquired on the overtime for the investigations and communications division; Commissioner Rojas and Commissioner Espinosa elaborated and suggested to increase the overtime budget. Solis stated that it's difficult to budget for overtime as officers get moved around and vacancies also increase the overtime. Iriarte also shared that vacancies and the training of the new employees affects the overtime.

Solis reported the Measure F Fire Department expenditures for FY 2023-2024 first quarter. Solis shared the employee services budget was \$733,989 for three Firefighter I/Paramedics, one Firefighter/Paramedic, and one Firefighter I/EMT-B. In capital outlay, they budgeted \$61,521 for the sales tax for the new fire engine. The fire engine was ordered last fiscal year, the full payment was paid

upfront. Solis also shared the transfer out to the Financing Authority for debt services for a portion of the financing of solar panels. The total expenses for the fire department were \$228,512.

The total Measure F expenses for both departments is \$792,969.

Commissioner Rojas inquired about the Best Buy online sales tax, Solis shared they're still going through the process.

A motion was made by Commissioner Rojas, second by Commissioner Espinosa, to accept and approve the presented financial report representing expenditures from July 1, 2023, through September 30, 2023, in accordance with Resolution No.2005-83.

6. COMMISSION COMMUNICATIONS

Commissioner Rojas inquired about the minors' daytime curfew. Chief Iriarte reported it was initiated by Dinuba Unified School District and the City of Dinuba to enforce a curfew to reduce truancy. Chief Iriarte stated the intention is to get students back to school.

Commissioner Martinez inquired about the motors unit. Chief Iriarte stated that it's the goal to bring motors back.

7. STAFF COMMUNICATIONS

Items from Fire Chief -

Interim Fire Chief Chastain shared that the recruitments for vacancies are for eight positions that are currently open. They continue to fill these positions and keep moving forward. Chastain provided a quick background of his career. Chastain started working for the City of Dinuba fire department back in 1998, and was recently promoted to Interim Fire Chief.

Items from Police Chief -

Chief Iriarte shared that there's two entry level officers that will be starting on November 27, 2023, and an additional officer is on backgrounds. There's one new dispatcher, and two additional officers have completed the FTO training. The department acquired new tasers, as the previous tasers were no longer going to be covered by the Axon liability insurance.

No items reported by Finance Director Solis.

No further staff communication were reported.

There being no further business to discuss, Chair Contreras adjourned the meeting at 6:47 pm.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In accordance with Resolution No. 2005-83, the Citizens' Oversight Committee is charged with reviewing expenditures of Police and Fire funds collected through the measure to determine whether funds are spent, as promised, on specific projects a part of the Public Safety Measure Police and Fire Plan. No Public Safety Measure funding may be spent on administrators' salaries (e.g. department heads); General Fund or City Funds including roads, overpasses, bridges, parks or projects not a part of the Public Safety Measure Police and Fire Expenditure Plan.

OUTSTANDING ISSUES

None.

DISCUSSION

Revenue for the second quarter was a total of \$855,193, of which \$828,311 is from sales tax and \$26,881 from investment earnings.

Pages 1-3 in the attached Exhibit 1, represent Public Safety Measure F Police Department

expenditures for the period October 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023 by expenditure category.

Salaries and benefits for the second quarter of 2023-24 represent the amount paid for ten officers, one detective, and two dispatchers.

Maintenance and operations for the first quarter represent the following expenditures:

- Operating Supplies \$847 was for medical supplies & laptop batteries for new patrol units
- Fuel and Lubricants \$12,878 was incurred for the Measure F patrol vehicles
- Communications \$3,139 for cell phone and internet connection charges.
- Professional & Technical- \$185 for annual fire extinguisher services
- Training & Vocational- \$1,378 Training
- Vehicle Maintenance \$4,967 for routine maintenance on Measure F fleet.

Principal and interest payments of \$52,439 were made for three detective, two K-9 units and 12 patrol units. There was an initial payment of \$30,419 for new Tasers, which included both principal and taxes and adjusted to reflect correct amount of \$28,430.

In Capital Outlay Vehicles, expenses totaling \$2,341 were incurred for graphics and radio communication installation services for the new patrol units. In Machinery and Equipment, expenses totaling \$16,123 were incurred for the purchase of eight (8) Mobile Data Terminals (MDT's) for the new patrol units.

Allocated costs of \$21,435 represent the amount paid for liability, auto and risk management insurance charges for the Measure F officers, dispatchers and detectives for the quarter.

Pages 3-4 in **Exhibit 1** represents Public Safety Measure F Fire Department expenditures for the period October 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023 by expenditure category.

Salaries and benefits are for four Firefighter I/Paramedics and one Firefighter/EMTB.

In maintenance and operations, the following expenditures were made:

- \$7,667 was expensed for supplies including batteries, gas monitors, and other safety equipment.
- In Utilities \$1,948 was used for the electricity and gas at the fire facility.

Allocated costs of \$5,506 represent the amount paid for liability, auto and risk management insurance charges.

Transfers out of \$4,111 were made for a portion of the debt service payment for the solar panels that tie into the fire facility.
